Residents provide supervised clinical eye and vision care services and experience a mix of learning methods including self-directed learning, seminar, workshop and conference participation, laboratory and clinical teaching, and scholarship activities. Cornea and Contact Lenses (1 position): This residency is designed to extend and refine your knowledge and skill in the areas of cornea and specialty contact lenses such as orthokeratology, corneal and scleral GP (for example keratoconus, ocular surface protection, multifocal and toric designs) and lenses for astigmatism, presbyopia and myopia control. Vision Rehabilitation: Emphasis on Low Vision Rehabilitation (1 position): The residency curriculum is an educational program focused on patient care primarily in the Low Vision Clinic, with some patient care in the Primary and Acute Care clinics and possibly the External Geriatrics clinic. Intended to enhance skills in the assessment and rehabilitation of individuals with low vision ages 3 and older. Ocular Disease: Emphasis on Glaucoma(1 position): This residency is designed to extend and refine your knowledge and clinical skills in the diagnostic and therapeutic management of patients with a variety of ocular diseases with an emphasis on the management of glaucoma. Pediatric Optometry: Emphasis on Vision Therapy and Vision Rehabilitation(1 accredited;1 non accredited positions): This residency is designed to extend and refine the resident's knowledge and skill in specific areas of pediatric optometry and binocular vision therapy, including management of dysfunctions of the eye movement, accommodative and binocular vision systems. Aspects of visual perceptual system assessment and management will also be covered. Primary Care: Emphasis on Ocular Disease (1 non accredited position): This residency is designed for the resident to learn advanced management of complex cases. Residents will become proficient in managing ocular disease in a rural optometric setting.
